The first order I placed for myself this year (2012) was in March and has 20% VAT, all orders (2010 thru 2011) before this order had 19% VAT and all orders since March 2012 have 20% VAT.

I did some digging yesterday and as far as I can make out for non-VAT registered purchasers, items coming into the UK from within the EU must have UK VAT applied to them or they'll be seized by customs which conflicts with the 'general rule' of paying the VAT rate for the country purchased from. I'll phone the VAT people today (I meant to yesterday but forgot).

Shapeways has no control over the VAT/Customs rates, they are set by the country and we comply with customs declarations as accurately as possible to avoid delays. Obviously customs does as it pleases, and randomly holds up packages regardless!

Phxman, to address this query:

"I have done dummy runs, and there are problems, choosing Pounds Sterling, and choosing delivery out of country of originating Order."

The billing address and the shipping address must be in the same country. So you can send a gift to someone in the same country as you, but not overseas. We set it up this way to minimize the risk of fraud.
