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I had not designed a coffee cup for a long time. The previous one was the Moebius Cup I think. So here is a new one.
The Sphere Cup:

This cup should contain 50ml of coffee, enough for an espresso. Its design is very simple: it is only made of spheres and planes. the advantage of the sphere is that it contains a maximum of volume for a minimum of surface. I used a new technique of modeling to insure a constant thickness and no sharp angle.

I hope you will like it. Any feedback is welcomed.

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I realize that perhaps it is not easy to understand the shape of the handle: it is a flat portion of disc

filling the void left when removing from the initial sphere another sphere of the same size. A second disc makes the bottom of the cup.

But, this being said, you are right: I designed this cup more with aesthetical considerations in mind than functional ones .

This will be also the case with my next cup that is currently being uploaded....

This is an upgrade of the Concave Mug: its new shape is more efficient in terms of capacity (that's why I made it smaller). But it is not as concave as the initial shape, thus its weird name.
Only the inner sphere should be hot (hopefully).
