The model has been sprayed with a base paint of Revell (tested Tamiya base paint on another model and that works fine too). After which I painted it with Vallejo Acrylic paints, just my preference, the acrylics from Tamiya are also great.

The doors and windows are made of etched brass ... in this scale they would become too thin (0.25 mm) to print.
