- 2) It houses 3 compartments (2 lower and 1 upper)
- 3) Nothing of the plastic is thrown away (it is also meant to be a drive-thru snack (plastic can snap to places)
- 4) You can get creative!

We would like the design to exceed the sketches. Something radical and contemporary is advisable. Preferably.

Please let us know if this sparks your interest! And quote us. for a simple 3D modeling as to print it with ShapeWays before we print in plastic in large quantities.
