Paints... a quick spray with Krylon primer, then common acrylic paints.

Simple Green... <http://www.simplegreen.com/>

It's a common cleaner. I've used it before on metal and resin castings for paint removal -- usually just needs to let it soak for a couple of days.

Active ingredients per their MSDS sheet:

Water

2-butoxyethanol

Ethoxylated Alcohol

Tetrapotassium Pyrophosphate

Sodium Citrate
